




#### CHARLESTON'S EARLY SUBURBAN MANSIONS

Stroll through Mazyck - Wraggborough, an early suburb of Charleston. You will be enchanted by its stately churches and lovely homes and gardens. Catch your breath as you stand on the highest point of ground in the city of Charleston and see the replica of the Hunley, the first submarine to be used successfully in naval warfare. Highlights of this tour will be visits to the Aiken Rhett House built in 1719 and the Joseph Manigault House c. 1803. At the Aiken Rhett House, a marvelous preservation of an urban plantation, the docents interpret not only the architecture but the lives of both the owners who were prominent South Carolinians, and their African American servants.


The Joseph Manigault House has an elegant collection of period furniture and a charming garden which is kept up by the Garden Club of Charleston.
